Maps the path of pan-Wesleyan Christologies

An international group of pan-Wesleyan scholars address this question posed by Jaroslav Pelikan: What happened to Methodist Christology after Wesley? Vickers's work on Methodist Christology in *The Oxford Handbook of Methodist Studies* sketched a preliminary answer. This book fills it out. The book is in two parts. Part one is a robust study of Methodist Christology from the Wesleys onward. Moving beyond the historical survey, part two aims to set trajectories for the future of pan-Wesleyan Christology.

John Deschner's monograph *Wesley's Christology* (1960) blazed a trail for subsequent smaller-scale treatments of John Wesley's doctrine of Christ, such as chapters in Randy Maddox's *Responsible Grace* (1994) and Ken Collins's *Theology of John Wesley* (2007). This book reopens a line of interpretation that is ripe for reconsideration.



Imagine the possibilities of a nonsexist Church that advocates justice for all.

Christian feminist theology challenges traditional theology and church practices that have restricted half of God's people from serving God and the church as priests, pastors, teachers, and baptizers. This book offers a constructive argument and biblical examples to suggest a dynamic adaptation and revision of customs in narratives, prophecy, and wisdom, including especially the incarnation and in Jesus's life and teaching. After carefully defining "feminism" and examining the biblical text, the author emphasizes that outsiders and Othered peoples are represented in the Bible as loved and used by God, even though the privileged have actively discriminated against them and continue to do so both in and out of ecclesial structure.

Christian feminists seek to find, listen, and raise the voices of women and others' experiences through diverse means, in order to contribute to the spread of the gospel, redemption, and justice for all.

Karen Strand Winslow, a noted Old Testament scholar, is Professor of Biblical Studies, Chair of Biblical and Theological Studies, and Director of the Masters of Arts in Theological Studies at Azusa Pacific Seminary, Azusa Pacific University. She is also an ordained elder of Free Methodist Church, Southern California Conference.




Early Methodism as seen by its adversaries and detractors

This book examines eighteenth-century pamphlet attacks on early Methodism that came from all sides—the episcopacy, clergy, other Christian groups, universities, Wesley's ex-preachers, ex-Methodist laity, the Calvinist branch of Methodism, and the secular community. This work also references more than six hundred pamphlets and books published in Great Britain between 1739 and 1800 by opponents of the evangelical revival. Kirkham presents a more nuanced view of the emergence of Methodism. His conviction is that a reappraisal of works antagonistic to the movement and its principals offers a fresh perspective and needed corrective to the legend of Wesley and his admirers and biographers.

Donald Kirkham, PhD, is a retired United Methodist elder and former Associate Professor (Adj.) of United Methodist Studies, Yale University Divinity School. A popular lecturer and speaker, he is also a Dempster Fellow.

Transformation carries political consequences.


Even in his own day, there were social repercussions to Wesley's theology of transformational grace. The revivalistic nature of early Methodism included both an emphasis on individual salvation and corporate salvation, with emphasis on the individual often overshadowing the corporate in many local church settings. However, at its core, Methodism was constituted by communities shaped by the radical call to new birth and was seen from the beginning as potentially subversive, having a political edge whether the early Methodists intended it to or not.

This book helps Wesleyans begin to both discuss and address political issues without the partisanship and tribalism that marks our discourse. The balance inherent within Methodism is too easily lost without a grounding in scripture, tradition, reason, and the experience of salvation.

The purpose of this bilingual edition in Spanish and English is to connect John Wesley with the two main reformers, Luther and Calvin, exploring what he drew from each of them and what he rejected. González clarifies the nature and method of Wesley's theology, which Albert Outler famously christened the Quadrilateral, and he suggests that, while helpful, to be more descriptive of Wesley's intent and the spirit of the Reformation to scripture, reason, tradition, and experience, we must add mission.

Justo L. González, PhD, author of more than eighty books, has taught at the Evangelical Seminary of Puerto Rico, Candler School of Theology at Emory University, Columbia Theological Seminary, and the Interdenominational Theological Center. A leading voice in Hispanic theology, he founded the Asociación para la Educación Teológica Hispana and served as the first executive director of the Hispanic Theological Initiative.




