HISTORY AND VISION

The International Association of Methodist-related Schools, Colleges, and Universities (IAMSCU) was created during the 16th World Methodist Conference in Singapore in 1991 by representatives of 20 institutions. Currently, more than 1,000 educational institutions in 80 countries are affiliated to IAMSCU. IAMSCU's vision is to support a dynamic, worldwide network that is engaged in effective inter-institutional cooperation and involved in many forms of collaboration. Together, these institutions are forming a new generation of Christian leaders inspired by the Wesleyan and Methodist traditions.

MEMBERS

Participation in the association is open to schools, colleges, theological seminaries, and universities from around the world which are connected to the Wesleyan and Methodist traditions of education.

MISSION AND GOALS

IAMSCU aims to promote the development of quality and value-centered education, thereby providing better life for people:

- 1. To increase the availability of education opportunities throughout the world
- 2. To improve the quality of education
- 3. To enable Methodist-related educational institutions to cooperate and develop common understandings

PREVIOUS IAMSCU CONFERENCES

The first IAMSCU Conference was held in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, in 1996. The second conference was Bristol, England, in 1998, celebrating the 250th anniversary of the founding of Kingswood School — the first Methodist school, established by John Wesley in Bath, England. The third IAMSCU Conference took place at Methodist College in Belfast, Northern Ireland, in 2001. The fourth conference was held at Westminster School, in Marion, South Australia, in July 2005. The fifth conference was held at the Universidad del Centro Latinoamericano (UCEL) in Rosario, Argentina, in July 2008. The sixth conference was held in July 2011, in Washington, DC, the United States, jointly with the National Association of Schools and Colleges of the United Methodist Church (NASCUMC). The seventh IAMSCU Conference was hosted by Hiroshima Jogakuin University in Hiroshima, Japan, in May 2014. The next conference will take place in Puebla, Mexico, under the auspices of the Universidad Madero (UMAD) and is planned for May 27-31, 2017.

THE IAMSCU 2017 CONFERENCE

Since its foundation in 1991, in Singapore, IAMSCU has continued to affirm its commitment to Methodist education worldwide. Starting with its conference in Australia in 2005, IAMSCU now holds its international conference every three years, always in a different location. After recent meetings in North America and the Asia Pacific region, IAMSCU will gather in Mexico, Latin America. Mexico is easily accessible from various parts of the world, with very good logistic connections. The IAMSCU Conference will continue to be an international and multicultural gathering that brings together educators from Africa, Asia Pacific, Europe, Latin America, and North America.

CONFERENCE THEME

Puebla is the perfect location for the IAMSCU Conference 2017. It allows us to expand on the topic of the previous conference in Hiroshima in 2014 — "Peace, Reconciliation, and Human Rights" — and connect it with a new main theme that is at the center of contemporary debates: "Tearing Down Walls: A Pathway to Peace, Healing, and Humanity."

 (please indicate the main topic of your choice based on the list above and send an abstract of 250 words by this date)
- December 15: Date when the results of the selection process will be known.
- January 15: Deadline for the confirmation of participation in the conference program.
- April 15: Deadline for the submission of draft papers to be presented at the conference.
- May 27-31: Conference dates, when papers will be presented.

Selected papers will be published by IAMSCU and distributed globally to the network of more than 1,000 IAMSCU member institutions
